

St. Josephine Bakhita

St. Josephine Bakhita was a young girl in Darfur, Sudan when she was captured and sold into slavery. Despite serving under cruel masters for many years, she remained sweet and kind. Eventually, the Michielis, who treated her very kindly, bought her. While in Italy, they introduced her to the Canossian Sisters of Charity. She joined in 1893. She spent the rest of her time there as a cook and sacristan. She also helped to prepare young sisters.

Unconditional love

Children learn about God's love by experiencing love from their parents Children who feel unconditionally loved by their parents are less likely to fear failure or judgment and more likely to look at their parents as advocates rather than adversaries They are also more likely to be open to a relationship with a loving God as Father

"A wise son hears his father's instruction, but a scoffer does not listen to rebuke" (Proverbs 13:1)

Forgiveness leads to holiness

In family life, conflict may be commonplace as children learn to navigate relationships but learning how to forgive is essential to healthy

development: Forgiveness is also essential for holiness. "If you forgive others their transgressions, vour heavenly Father will forgive you" (Matthew

6:14) Teach

children how: Say the words. Encourage children to say, "I'm sorry," "I was wrong," when they have hurt someone. Asking for forgiveness starts the process of recognizing when they have transgressed and understanding that amends must be made. When someone says the words, immediately offer forgiveness by saying, "I forgive you."

Release grudges. Old resentments keep us from fully experiencing Cod's love and forgiveness. Encourage each member of the family to write at least one grudge or

resentment they are ready to let go of on a piece of paper and put it into a 'grudge jar." Then, take out all the grudges, rip them up, and move on.

Practice humility. Humility reminds us

saints-in-progress who need God's mercy. We are flawed beings who make

mistakes that require God's forgiveness. Offering mercy to others in recognition of this need is an act of both humility and hope.

Pray for each other. Praying together as a family opens us up to much-needed graces. Plus, it's hard to stay mad at someone for whom you pray!



Why do Catholics serve pancakes on Fat Tuesday (Mardi Gras)?

In the early Church, it was customary to give up rich foods and meat during the penitential season of Lent. This included milk, eggs. butter, cheese, and fat, On the Tuesday before Lent began, families would rush to empty the pantry of the

forbidden foods by enjoying a dinner of pancakes (or in some places, fried doughnuts). In several countries, it is even called "Pancake Tuesday." It was meant to be one final celebration of feasting before the Lenten fast.

The positive power of penance

Children of all ages know that if we make a mess, we must clean it up and try not to do it again. Penance is a lot like that – it helps us clean up our sin and avoid repeats. Help children appreciate penance.

Self-denial. Suggest small sacrifices that are age appropriate - skipping a favorite TV show, foregoing an hour of video games, or passing on dessert. Then suggest that the discomfort can be offered to God as an apology for past wrongs

Acts of kindness Our sin affects others

so helping others also helps us make up for our sins

Assisting a neighbor, volunteering at church, or showing kindness to a friend, can be offered to

God as penance

Do I have to?" When you ask your child to do something he doesn t have to do and may not enjoy remind him that it can be offered as penance. Visiting elderly relatives, playing patiently with younger siblings, doing homework without reminders are sacrifices that can be offered as penance.

Opening of RE-REGISTRATION FEE - January 22 2024

Dear Parents.

The completed re-registration form and fee are due on or before Monday, February 26, 2024

- 1. Everyone needs to re-register to secure a place for the next school year, 2024-2025 including those who presently attend St. Martha School.
- 2. Fill out the re-registration form completely. Include the new or current home address, e-mail, phone numbers: home, work, and cell.
 - a. Write the names of all students to be re-registered, starting with the oldest child. If you have a **TK** students coming to the school next year, include his/her on the TK Registration.
 - b. Write the grade each student will be in for the 2024-2025 school year.
 - c. Enclose there-registration fee (\$220.00 per child) grades TK-8.
 - d. Late registration fee, \$100.00 additional per child.
 - e. After February 29, 2024 a late re-registration fee of \$100.00 per child plus the re-registration fee (\$320) will be charged.
- 3. No-registration will be processed unless accompanied with the appropriate fee.
- 4. The re-registration fee is non-refundable.

PLEASE NOTE: Any family, who is not planning to return next year to St. Martha School, please let the office know by February 26, 2024.

(If we have not received your re-registration formor heard from you by March 26 2024, your child's name will be dropped from the roster. Should you wish to be reinstated, and space is still available, a \$100 late fee per child plus the re-registration fee of \$220.00 will be charged.)

PARENTAL AGREEMENT — 2024-2025

As the first educators of their children, parents are to help the parish and the parish school complement, reinforce, and support the fundamental purpose of Catholic Education.

SCHOOL REQUIREMENTS for each family:

- 1. I/We agree and understand that the school is Catholic parish school, under the jurisdiction of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. We accept, therefore: a) that the pastor of the parish is the ex-officio chief administrative officer of the school who carries out the policies on points not covered by Archdiocesan policy, and determines policy appropriate to the needs of the school; b) that the principal is responsible for the immediate direction and supervision of the school program.
- 2. I/We agree that this is a Catholic school and that we as parents have a sacred duty to set a religious example for our child/ren by fulfilling our Catholic Christian obligation.
- 3. I/We agree that as this is a parish school of St. Martha, to qualify for the Martha of Bethany Scholarship we must be registered at the Church Rectory.
- 4. Yes, I want to apply for the Martha of Bethany Scholarship. A <u>Sunday Envelope</u> must be provided to show proof that the Family is registered. My Envelope Number is ________ (Please attach your Sunday Family Envelope. If your Sunday Envelope is not attached, the out of Parish Tuition Price will be charged.)
- 5. I/We agree to fulfill our Financial obligation as chosen in the Financial agreement.
- 6. I/We agree to enforce the school policies as stated in the Parent/Student Handbook.
- 7. I/We agree to help support the school by giving 10 School Service Hours or equivalent monetary donation and 5 Fiesta Hours to St. Martha School during the 2024- 2025 school year. Service Hours must be completed by May 16, 2025. Unworked hours will be charged at \$25.00 per hour and should be paid no later than May 16, 2025. There will be a \$30.00 penalty on missed scheduled hours.
- 8. I/We agree to support St. Martha School the Tech Fee as stated on the Fees Payment Plan of \$50.00.
- 9. I/We agree to support my/our child/ren by attending the St. Martha PTO meetings.
- 10. I/We agree to support the school **Fundraisers** as stated on the Fees Payment Plan fee of \$350.00.
- 11. I/We agree to be a member of St. Martha PTO Board by each family paying the PTO fee of \$200.00.
- 12. I/We agree to be actively involved and supportive of additional school functions as announced by the School Board, the PTO Board, and/or by the school during the school year.
- 13. I/We agree that each year we must re-apply for admission to the next academic year. Admission to the next academic year may be denied to any existing, new or returning student(s) or families if they are delinquent with any school financial obligations, and if there are academic or discipline problems.
- 14. Payment plan for St. Martha School Tuition, Full Time Day Care, is through the FACTS Tuition Management Program. This is an automatic debit system to collect Tuition, Full Time Day Care.
- 15. A monthly \$25.00 late charge fee will be billed to your account for non payment of past due accounts over 30 days. This includes miscellaneous charges, Drop-In Day Care, etc.

16. If payment to FACTS MANAGEMENT is returned without prior notice to the school: 1) for stop payment, 2) account closed, and/or 3) insufficient funds, three (3) times, a fee of \$100.00 will be charged by the school in addition to the fees charged by FACTS.

17. In the event a check is returned to the school for any reason, a \$35.00 return check service charge will be added to the collection of the returned check amount and the amount must be paid in cash, cashiers check or money order. The second incident, all payments must be made in cash, cashiers check, or money order, for the balance of the school year.

17. If we have read and understand the above agreement for 2024 – 2025 school year as presented by St. Martha School. 17. We promise to fulfill each of the stated obligations on time. (This Contract and Fees are to be signed and returned to the school office no later than Friday, August 16, 2024.
